

SPNRD BOARD SETS ALLOCATIONS FOR THE 2025 - 2027 ALLOCATION PERIOD

As you may recall, county wide advisory meetings were held in Sidney, Chappell, and Kimball to discuss the proposed amendments to the Districtwide Ground Water Management Area (GWMA) Rules and Regulations. The amendments were also a main topic at the February, March, and April 2024 SPNRD Board Meetings; additionally, a public hearing was held on May 13, 2024. The purpose of the meetings was to provide an opportunity for the public to present testimony or other relevant evidence.

The District received official testimony in support of the proposed changes from the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources and the Nebraska Department of Environment and Energy. After considering all testimony and evidence, the District approved and adopted the



Amended and Restated GWMA Rules and Regulations. The effective date was June 14, 2024. There were no changes to the allocations from the current period.

Allocations are of great importance to producers. The color-coded map shows allocations which commence in 2025 for all subareas. The Board sets allocations approximately one (1) year in advance of each new allocation period.

Additionally, carry-forward of up to ten (10) Acre-Inches is allowed following the three (3) year Allocation Period in Subareas A, B, C, D, E, and F. The cap on the amount of carry-forward that may be accumulated over multiple Allocation Periods and used in subsequent Allocation Periods is ten (10) Acre-Inches.

COST SHARE PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT

WATER WELL ABANDONMENT PROGRAM


Unused or abandoned water wells can be a direct pathway to ground water where harmful sediments, bacteria, chemicals, waste, or rodents can cause contamination. Additionally, they can pose a safety hazard for humans and animals.

Because of this potential threat to ground water supplies, the Water Well Decommissioning Fund was established by the 1994 Nebraska Legislature and is administered by the Department of Natural Resources. Nebraska state law requires that water wells that are no longer used be properly decommissioned (plugged and sealed) by a licensed water well contractor according to rules and regulations of the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services.

The SPNRD Water Well Abandonment Program provides cost share assistance to help encourage the proper decommissioning of water wells that are no longer needed or used. All categories of water wells are eligible. Cost share assistance of 65% of the actual costs for labor and material to decommission is available for District landowners. The maximum contribution by the District is \$600.00 for drilled water wells, and \$700.00 for hand-dug water wells. A landowner is eligible to receive funding assistance for three abandoned wells annually.

Applications will be accepted and approved anytime throughout the year, and are on a "first come, first served" basis and will continue until budget funds are expended.

The SPNRD Board of Directors appointed David Kucera during the May 14, 2024 meeting. His appointment begins immediately and ends January 9, 2025.
